Membership

CQC Membership

The motion was made and approved for the guild to join the <u>Colorado Quilting Council</u> (CQC). This will hopefully provide more resources to the guild leading up to our show this fall at the <u>Rocky Mountain Quilt</u> <u>Museum</u>. It will also let us provide more information to our members regarding regional classes and other offerings around the state.

Treasurer's Report

Currently we have \$2060.46 in our bank account. Our obligation to the national <u>Modern Quilt Guild</u> has already been paid (\$850 based on our membership from last October). We currently have 35 members that have paid their dues for 2017 so far.

Committees

- Location: The location committee has met and would like to have quarterly sew days in each of the four relative quadrants of our metro area. Each sew day would be hosted by a member in that area. For business meetings we are looking at a possible schedule that would for the rest of the year have every other meeting at <u>Fancy Tiger Crafts</u>, and another location. If you have any ideas for a good location to host meetings or sew days please let the board know.
- Education/Programs: We are still looking for a committee chair to head up this committee. If you are interested please let any of the board members know.
- Outreach: The motion was made and an informal vote passed to eliminate this committee in favor of an option to create ad-hoc committees for each project as necessary. Please look for the changes that will need to be made in our bylaws to make this one official. (See below)
- Hospitality: Denise VonMinden has stepped up to host our hospitality committee; please contact her if you would like to help out.
- *How New is Modern?* Quilt Show (Rocky Mountain Quilt Museum)
 - If you are planning on having a quilt in the show please make sure that you have filled out the <u>Commitment Form</u> on the website.

- Catalog Book options were presented by Kari Vojtechovsky and included both a print-ondemand option and a local print shop option. Much of the discussion was around how much risk the guild is willing to take in order to produce a high-quality catalog book of all of the quilts featured in the show. Also noteworthy is the willingness of our guild members with the appropriate professional skills to produce this book. Please look for more discussion finalizing these plans in the next few months.
- Photography of each quilt was discussed, and the plans include outdoor photos of the quilts in various places that showcase the quilts and our scenic Colorado landscapes. Plans for how each quilt will be photographed, as well as a more generic program on quilt photography will be provided at the June meeting.
- Bees
 - Susan Santistevan discussed the concept of the roaming bee. Look for a new page to be coming to the website containing this information and pictures, as well as when they expect to be completed and open sign ups.
 - Emily Smith discussed the Brave bee and some of the challenges that we have faced with this bee. Look for more information coming to the website on this be and any of the proposed changes that may be in the pipeline.

General Guild-wide Communication

In an effort to increase transparency and cultivate more of a virtual community we would like to ensure that all members know of all of the methods of communication that we will utilize.

- Slack is a free collaboration tool that allows for a chat room discussion as well as a great medium to discuss projects and share files and pictures from multiple platforms.
- We have set up a guild-wide <u>Slack Channel</u> with the availability of setting up private spaces for each committee. All members will be invited to join this channel, so look for a separate invite in your inbox soon.
- We will present a short tutorial on how to use it at the March meeting. If you want to install the app before the meeting it may be helpful.
